Sleep at the ASL emergency shelter in Laguna Canyon every night.



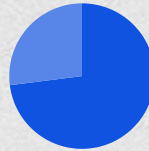
**608 PEOPLE**

Have stayed in one of our two housing-focused shelter programs to date in 2018. While there, clients work to find the best housing option to permanently end their homelessness.



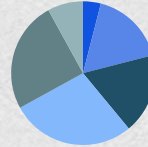
EMERGENCY SHELTER

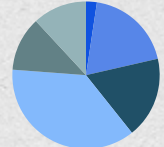

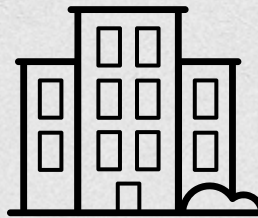
Program launched with 18 units. Designed for people with long history of homelessness & a disability.

OTHER TYPES OF HOUSING

This year alone\*, an additional 78 people have walked through the doors of one of our programs and into permanent housing. There are many doors to housing, and our staff is committed to working with each individual to determine the most appropriate solution based on their unique circumstance, abilities, and needs.
